IGETC Requirements Guidelines

Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) Requirements

Complete approx. 34 semester / 51 quarter units

Courses completed in one AREA may not count in a secondary AREA. Courses which are (or were previously) offered in more than one discipline (cross listed) may receive credit for only one of the cross listed courses. All courses must be completed with a grade of C (2.0) or higher. A

“Credit” or “Pass” that is defined by institutional policy as being equivalent to a grade of C (2.0) or higher may be applied to meet IGETC requirements. Courses used to meet IGETC requirements must have a minimum of 3 semester or 4 quarter units. (Exceptions may be made for English composition and Math. Speak to your advisor for details.)
